The Sermon	<i>"What If We were Innkeepers ...Would There Be Room?"</i>	*The Words of Institution The Proclamation of Christ P: As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death and resurrection until He comes again. C: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.
The Hymn of the Day	<i>#256 "Love Has Come"</i>	*The Lord's Prayer Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. *The Nicene Creed I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us people and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried and the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. *The Great Thanksgiving P: The Lord be with you. C: And also with you. P: Lift up your hearts. C: We lift them to the Lord. P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. C: It is right to give God thanks and praise.	<i>Lighting of the Candles</i> <i>The candle light is passed from the pastor to acolytes and assisting ministers who pass it to the congregation. Please be careful with open flames and our small children, For your safety and to prevent wax from dripping, please do NOT tilt your lit candle. Tip only the unlit candle. Hold your candle straight up and it will not drip. Please blow out the flame gently.</i>	 P: As the light of these candles illumines our faces, it symbolizes the light of Christ, a child in the manger at Bethlehem, a Savior suffering our death on the cross, and soon to come from his throne on high as Judge of us all. He is our Light here on earth and the Eternal Light who enlightens heaven, where there is no need of candle or sun. Rejoice, for the Light of the world has come, who transforms us with the brightness of His glory. This is the message we have heard from Him and proclaimed to you: that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all.

C: If we say we have fellowship with Him but still walk in darkness, we lie, and do not live according to the truth.

P: But if we walk in the Light, as He is the Light, we have fellowship with one another.

C: And the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all our sins.

(The candlelight is passed and begins to spread throughout the congregation.)

P: You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and then cover its light. Instead they set the lamp on its stand, set it up high, and it lights everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before all people, that they may see your good works and give praise to your Father in heaven.

The Closing Hymn #253 "Silent Night"

***Confession and Absolution**

P: As we prepare to celebrate our Lord's birth, let us also remember the reason this Holy Child was born: He has appeared once and for all at the end of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of Himself.

C: We confess that we have sinned against God and against one another. We are powerless to undo the entangled mess of sin in our lives. We yearn for peace with God and reconciliation with one another, yet we cannot accomplish it ourselves. Forgive us, Lord, and restore our souls, that our lives reflect not our sin, but the joy of the birth or Your only Son into the world.

P: Jesus is Emmanuel, God-with-us. What we are powerless to do, He has done for us. His name is Jesus. He has come to save us from our sins. Therefore, in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ, I declare that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**
