Gregory was a sixth-century church leader who is often remembered as one of the "fathers of Christian worship" because of his work revising the liturgy and developing church music. Patrick was a missionary to Ireland. Called by God to carry the good news of Jesus to the Irish, he became one of the founders of the great Celtic tradition of Christianity.
