### ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL EXPLORES REVELATION MESSAGE Last Stops Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia and Laodicia, western Turkey

The above listed churches are the final seven to whom John addressed his letter in Revelation. All cities of wealth, they were chosen, like the others, for their unique challenges to the Christians.

Thyratira was know for its textiles and beautiful purple dyes, a color worn only by Roman royalty. Christ asked the Christians here improved faithfulness. Citizens of this city (was originally part of Greece) were deported back to Greece in 1922, a post WWI human genocidal disaster.

Sardis had, like Thyratira, been part of the Greek Empire until it was ceded to the Romans. Foods from Sardis include baklava, stuffed grape leaves, and kebabs. Jews had been settled here by an earlier king, and they thrived in readiness to be called to Christianity. Christ rebuked them in Revelation for spiritual deadness and warned them to repent. Formality and ritualism had replaced true Christianity, with lack of discernment in compromising Christianity to current culture.

Philadelphia's Christians received only praise from Christ through Revelation, and thus Protestant churches today may have Philadelphia in their name as a way to express faithfulness. The Christians here were vigorously persecuted, but they received Jesus' encouragement that while the Jews and Romans might then reject and persecute them, the God of the Jews would not. The Christians here were also deported in the Turk-Greek War post WWI disaster.

Laodicia thrived on a major trade route and lay on exceptionally fertile soil between rivers. In 200BC, 2000 Jews had been transported here from Babylonia as spoils of war, and thus they were ripe to establish a Christian church. Known for black wool trade, they city's renowned wealth is referred to in the Bible; some of its wealth supported the temple in Jerusalem. The medical school here was famous for its special ointment for treatment of eye problems. Paul the Apostle mentions his concern for Laedicia in the the book of Colossians, and first Timothy was written in Laodicia.

Rejoice and be glad, because I have a great reward waiting for you in heaven Matthew 5:12
